
Example of student responses on Padlet wall:



Step 1: Go to padlet.com and click on “Build a wall.”

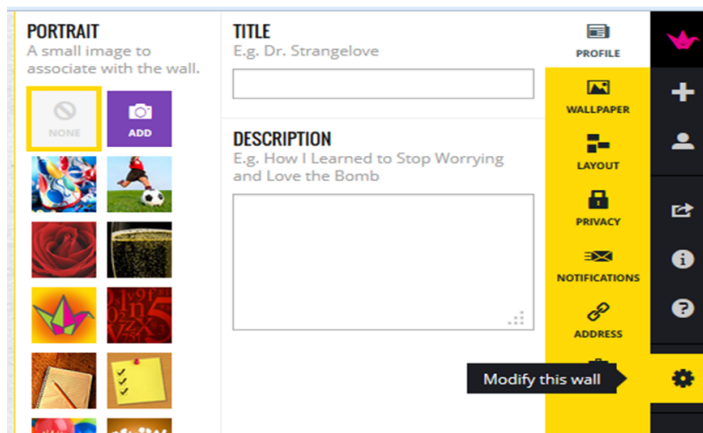

But, you might want to do a few more things while you're there, like:

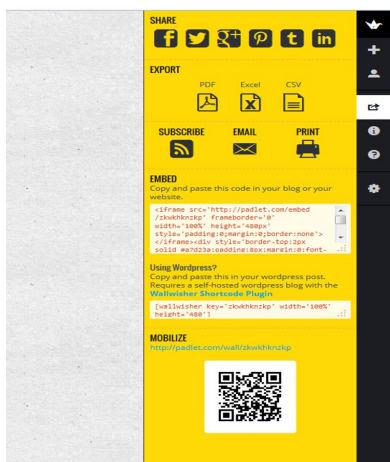
Modify your wall by:

- Giving it a title
- Changing the wallpaper
- Adding a “portrait” (small corner picture)
- Giving it a personalized URL
- Changing privacy settings
- Choosing to be notified when someone posts to your wall



Share/Export your wall by:

- Embedding the code for your wall in a blog or website (embeds beautifully in LibGuides!)
- Getting your wall's QR code
- Exporting the wall responses to a PDF, Excel, or CSV file
- Sharing your wall on your favorite social media sites
